## DESCRIPTION

The Duckworth-Williams House is a two-story English Tudor Revival residence. It is covered in stucco over brick construction, with an abundance of half-timbering on all elevations. A side-gable roof with a shed dormer extends to cover a full-length recessed front porch, which is supported by stuccoed piers. Windows are three-over-one, double-hung. The house sits on a large lot above the Siloam Springs City Park and features nicely landscaped grounds.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Criterion: C Area of significance: Architecture

The Duckworth-Williams House is a significant architectural resource as the only example of English Tudor Revival architecture in the city of Siloam Springs. Its attractive setting adds to its prominence in this small Northwest Arkansas town.
