DESCRIPTION

The Connelly-Harrington House has a combination of features which were common to a number of popular early-twentieth-century architectural styles. The house is a two-story structure, basically square in plan with a full-length one-story porch on the facade. Echoes of the Prairie Style are evident in the low-pitched hipped roof with wide overhanging eaves. Classical influences are displayed by overall symmetry of design, and in features such as sidelights to the entrance and the concrete base and brick-pier "capitals" of the porch, which are otherwise common to houses of Craftsman design. Balusters connecting these piers are also made of concrete, as are sills and lintels of all but the windows underneath the porch. Windows are all one-over-one double-hung with symmetrical placement. On the lower story of the facade, the entrance is flanked by a pair of windows, with this pattern being echoed on the second story.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Criterion: C Area of significance: architecture

The Connelly-Harrington House is significant as an example of the use of various architectural styles and their influence in early twentieth century construction. Elements of Prairie, Craftsman, and Classical design are all evident in the property. Originally built as the home of a prominent banker, the building was used during the 1930's as a hospital for John Brown University. Although later divided into apartments, it has been rehabilitated and now serves as the office for the Siloam Springs Chamber of Commerce.
