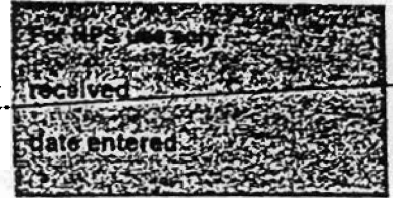

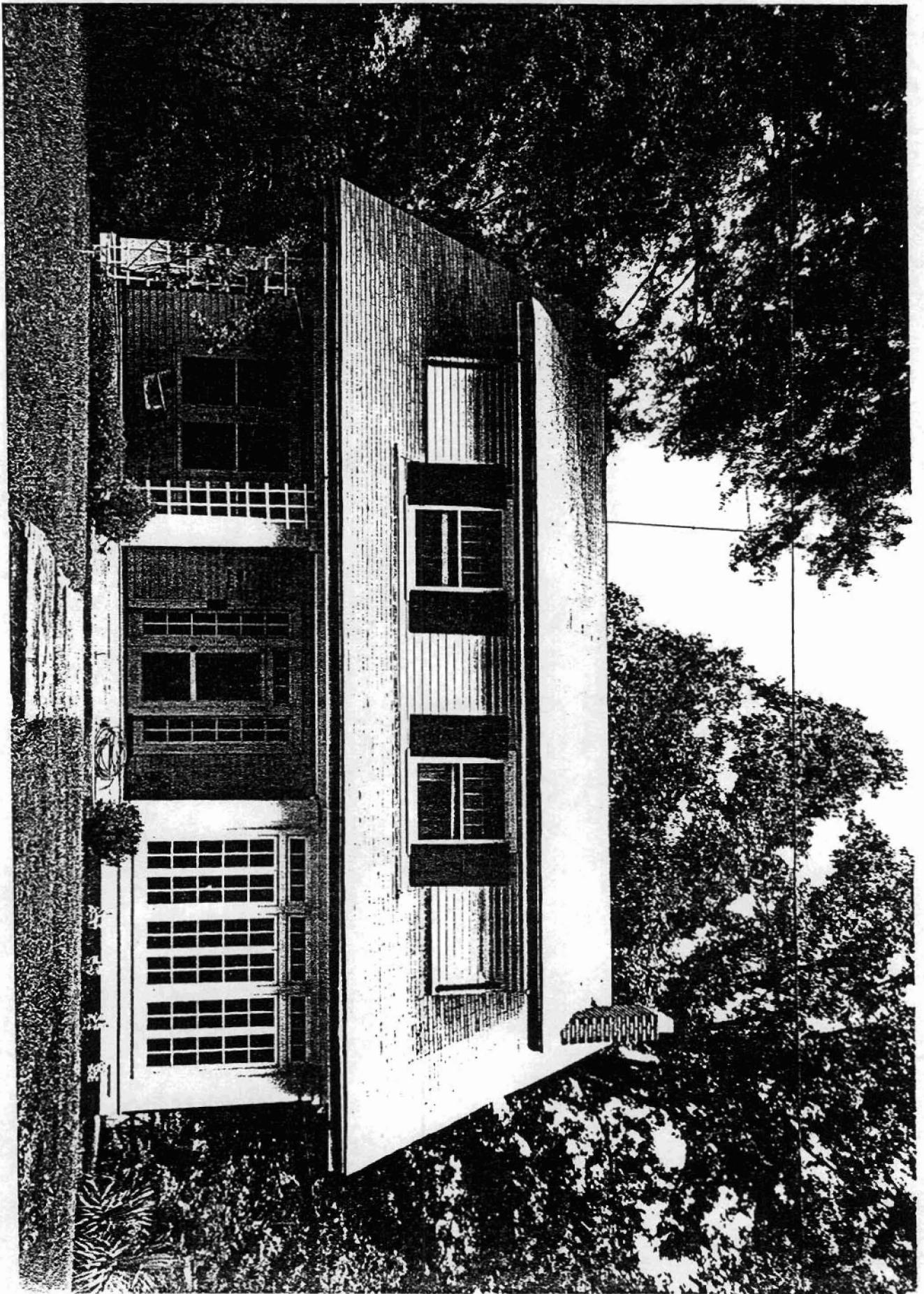

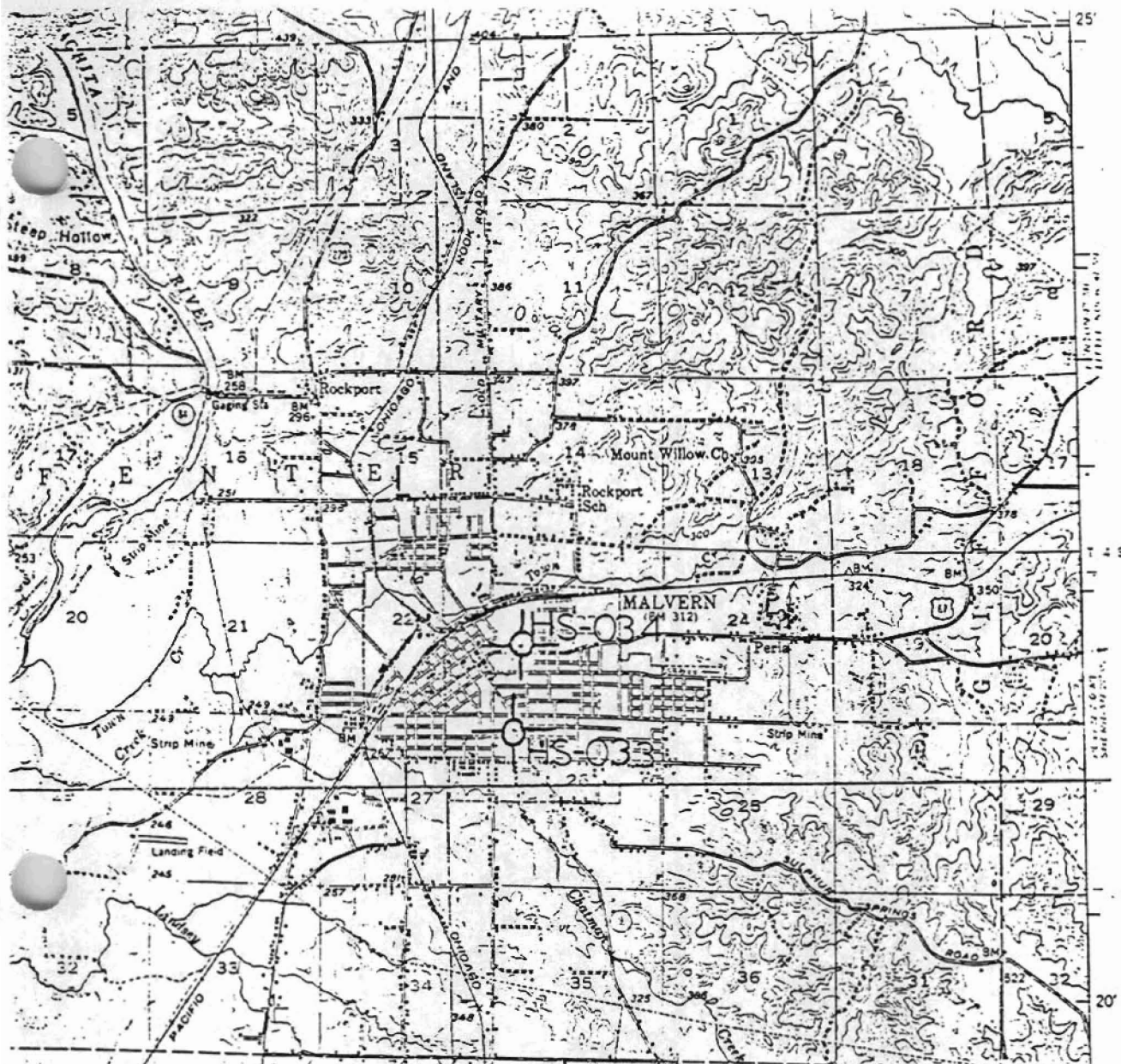
Physical Description

A familiar Thompson and Harding theme was the two-story Dutch Colonial house, here constructed on a modest size lot in Malvern around 1919. The strong, simple lines of the gable end roof dominate the design and shelter the large front porch. A long shed roofed dormer containing two windows appears on the front elevation. Faced with weatherboard and placed on a low brick foundation, the house has two exterior side chimneys and little decorative detail. Four large wood Tuscan-like columns with simple bases support the porch, one end of which is enclosed with casement windows forming an inviting sun porch. The front door has a single pane window; other windows are sash type with twelve-over-one lights.

Statement of Significance

The Thompson and Harding firm designed the house at 528 E. Page in Malvern, Arkansas in 1919, capitalizing upon the popular taste for the Dutch Colonial style. As in the firm's other Dutch Colonial designs, the large gable roof dominates the house and unifies the composition. Here, four over-sized Tuscan columns add a note of dignity and formality to the facade. Original to the design, the east end of the porch is enclosed with casement windows. The structure is an unusual and attractive variation of the Dutch Colonial motif in residences and is one of the most picturesque houses on a busy street in Malvern which is rapidly developing into a commercial area.
