Describe present and historic physical appearance:

SUMMARY:

The Guinn Dipping Vat is a concrete structure with an associated dripping platform located south of Forest Service Road 37 within the area that once was the logging town of Mauldin. The Guinn Dipping Vat is in good condition.

ELABORATION

The Guinn Dipping Vat is a concrete structure with an associated dripping platform located south of Forest Service Road 37 within the area that once was the logging town of Mauldin. The Guinn Dipping Vat is in good condition.

The property includes a concrete dipping vat terminating in a rock-and-mortar dripping pad and drain for recovering cattle-dip solution. The overall length of the vat and pad is approximately 35 feet long. The vat is about four feet wide and is likely between 1 and 2 meters deep. The vat is covered by a series of boards linked by metal cord.

The Guinn Dipping Vat is in good condition, with all of its walls intact with minimal signs of collapse, thus meeting the registration requirements of the multiple-property listing Dip That Tick: Texas Tick Fever Eradication in Arkansas, 1907-1943. The property has excellent integrity of location, remaining at its original site within the former logging community of Mauldin in Montgomery County, Arkansas, a location that also provides it with integrity of setting, feeling and association. It has superb integrity of design, showing little if any sign of deterioration. Its continued high degree of structural integrity is proof of its workmanship, and none of its original materials have been compromised.

SUMMARY:

The Guinn Dipping Vat is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A with local significance by virtue of its status as an intact concrete structure erected as part of the government effort to eradicate Texas tick fever from Arkansas cattle.

ELABORATION:

The town of Mauldin was owned by the Caddo River Lumber Company, which laid tracks to the area by the end of 1922 and built the town in 1923 to support harvesting of the region's abundant timber. The firm set the intersection of logging railroad lines and the main lines in the center of town and placed the town's principal structures – company office, boarding house, school and church – nearby. Two-room camp houses were moved in from Pike County and other structures, primarily shotgun houses, were erected to house loggers and their families.

The town was not centered on a town square, instead trailing along both sides of the railroad line for about two miles. Census records from 1930 showed that Mauldin had a population of 896. After all of the harvestable timber in Montgomery County was cleared by 1937, Caddo River Lumber Company extended a line to the town of Forester in Scott County northwest of Mauldin. The U.S. Forest Service bought the now-depopulated town of Mauldin in 1938.

After the Forest Service purchased the land, Mr. Mack Guinn constructed the Guinn Dipping Vat ca. 1940 to serve the cattle owners who lived in the area. It likely was in use at least until Arkansas was removed from the tick fever quarantine in 1943 and quite possibly after that time.
