Summary

An unusual fieldstone-veneered example of the Colonial Revival style, the Jeffries House occupies an elevated site originally comprised of two lots. Symmetrical in design, the central two-story section of the house is flanked by one-story wings. The original fieldstone-veneered two-car garage still stands behind the house.

Elaboration

Although its fieldstone veneer is out of the ordinary for the Colonial Revival style, the Jeffries House otherwise displays many typical characteristics of that style: a symmetrical main facade with a center doorway, a side-gabled roof, and multi-paned windows with double-hung sashes. One-story wings on either side of the central two-story section of the house add to the symmetrical balance of the main (south) facade, as do the chimneys that are located at each end of the central section.

The central doorway is another rather unusual feature because it is recessed rather than being sheltered by a portico, as is typical of the Colonial Revival style. A denticulated entablature spans the top of the recessed entry. The original front door and sidelights have been replaced.

Directly above the entry, an iron balcony is another departure from the standard Colonial Revival style. Opening onto the balcony is a pair of windows with triple-hung sashes. A similar triple-hung window is used in the rear (north) facade, where it marks the location of the interior stairway. Otherwise, the windows of the Jeffries House have six-over-six, double-hung sashes, except for those in the east wing. This wing encloses a sunroom, and its windows are multi-paned casements. French doors open from the front of this wing onto a small terrace.

Remnants of the original landscaping remain around the Jeffries house. A fieldstone wall runs perpendicular to the east end of the house; another wall runs between the house's west wing and the original two-car garage. A small decorative concrete pool remains in the yard directly behind the house.

The gable-roofed garage has the same fieldstone veneer as the main house. It was designed to house automobiles only; the maid's quarters were located in the west wing of the main house.

The highlight of the interior of the Jeffries House is the entry hall, where a stairway with

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Colonial detailing curves gracefully to the second floor.

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Summary

Criteria A and C, local significance

Built speculatively by the Justin Matthews Company in 1931, the Jeffries House was the last of sixteen residences completed in "Edgemont in Park Hill" before the Depression brought construction to a halt. As such, it represents the end of developer Justin Matthew's first attempt at catering to affluent homebuyers. Architecturally, the Jeffries House is significant as an unusual fieldstone-veneered example of the Colonial Revival style.

Elaboration

The Jeffries House was purchased for \$10,000 late in 1931 by T. Wade Jeffries, a salesman, and his wife, Lois Crafton Jeffries. Unfortunately, as the Depression dragged on, Mr. and Mrs. Jeffries increasingly were unable to make their mortgage payments; they finally lost the house about 1937.

In a pattern that was common for the houses in Edgemont, the Jeffries House was not sold again until the close of World War II. In the meantime, it was occupied by a renter. About 1944, the house was purchased by Dr. and Mrs. Aura C. Clark, and it remained Mrs. Clark's residence for the next forty years.

As the last of the Edgemont houses to be constructed, the Jeffries House holds a special place in the history of the area's development. As a work of architecture, the house is of note mainly because of its fieldstone veneer, which is unique among the Edgemont houses and unusual for a house obviously intended to be Colonial Revival in style.

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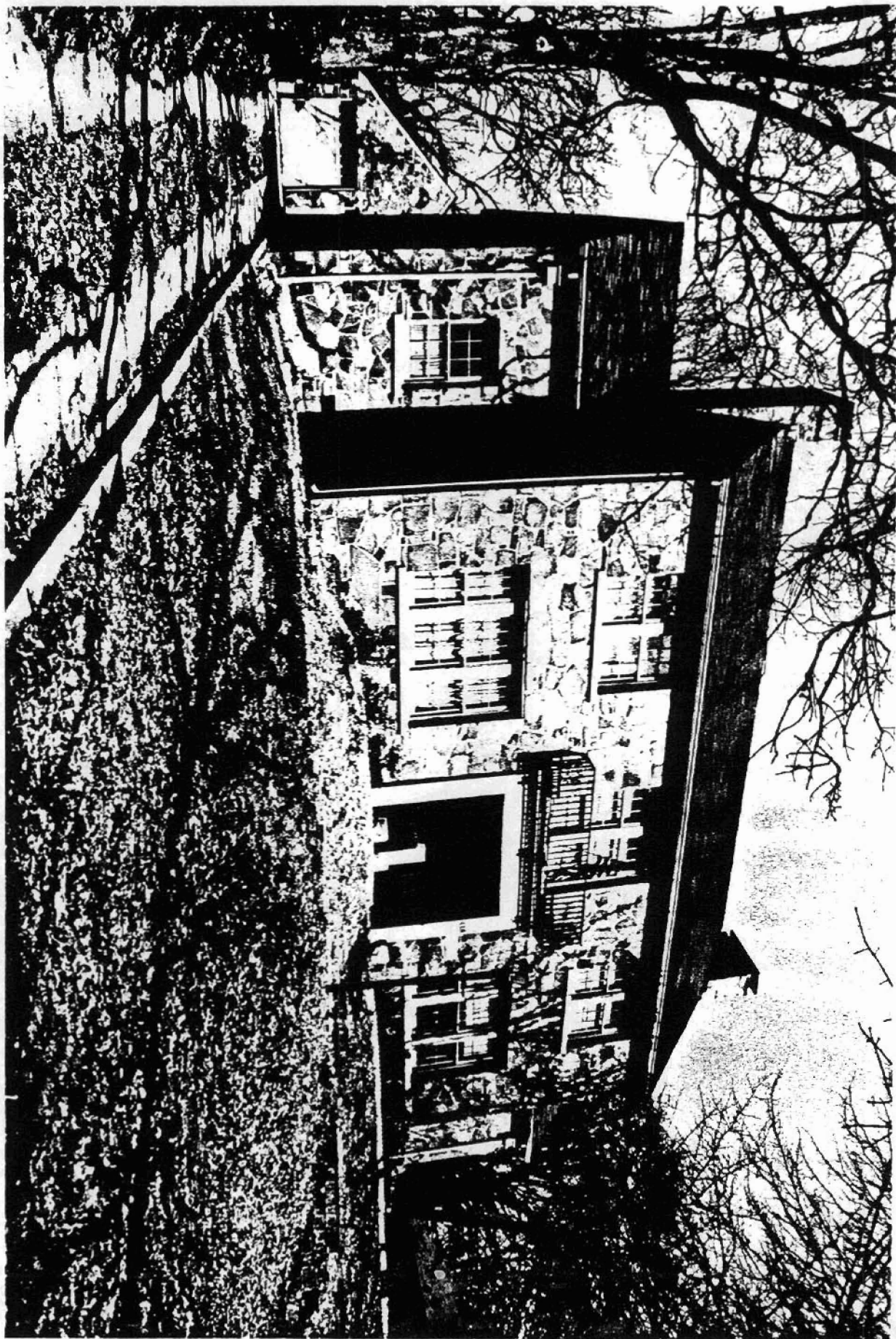

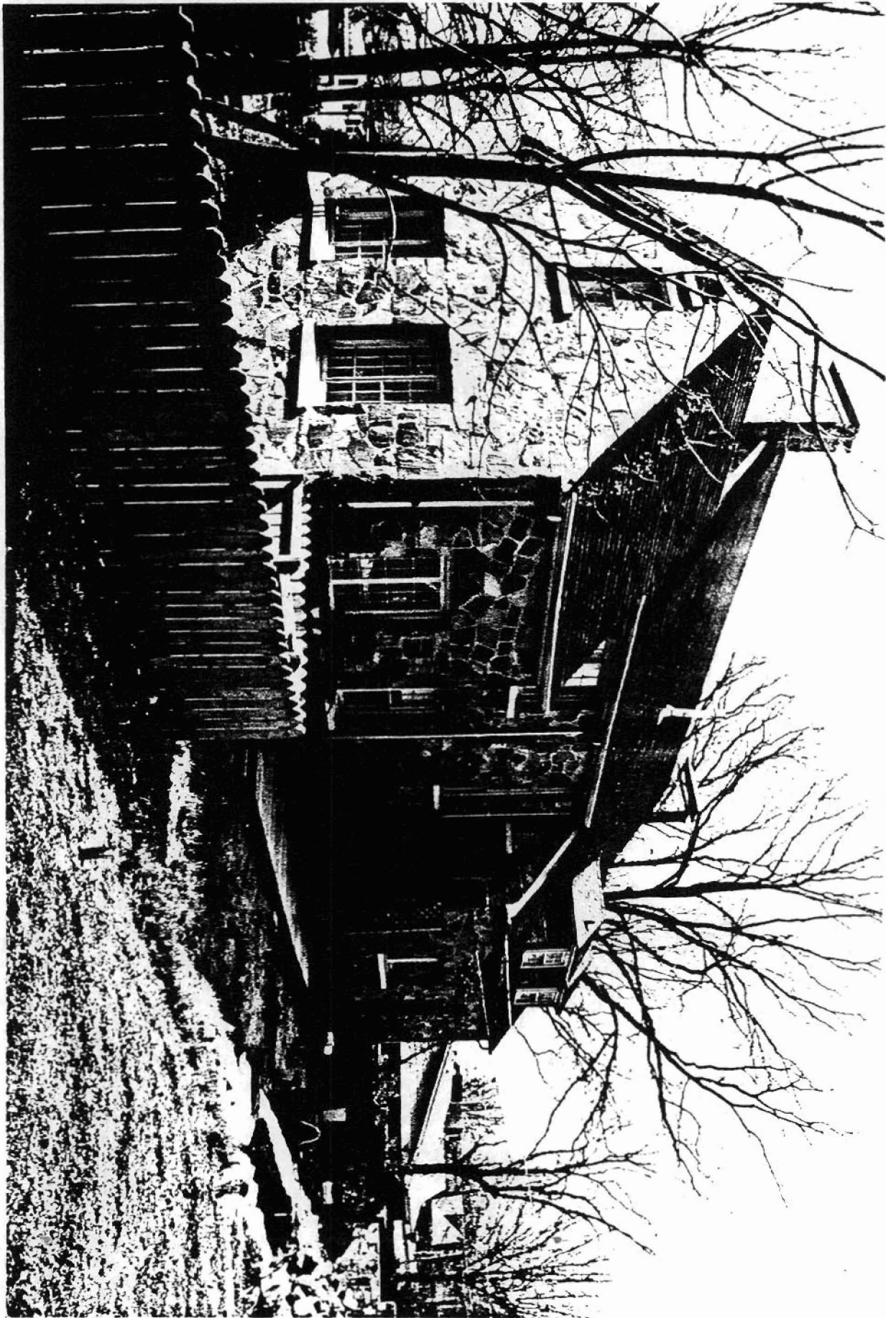

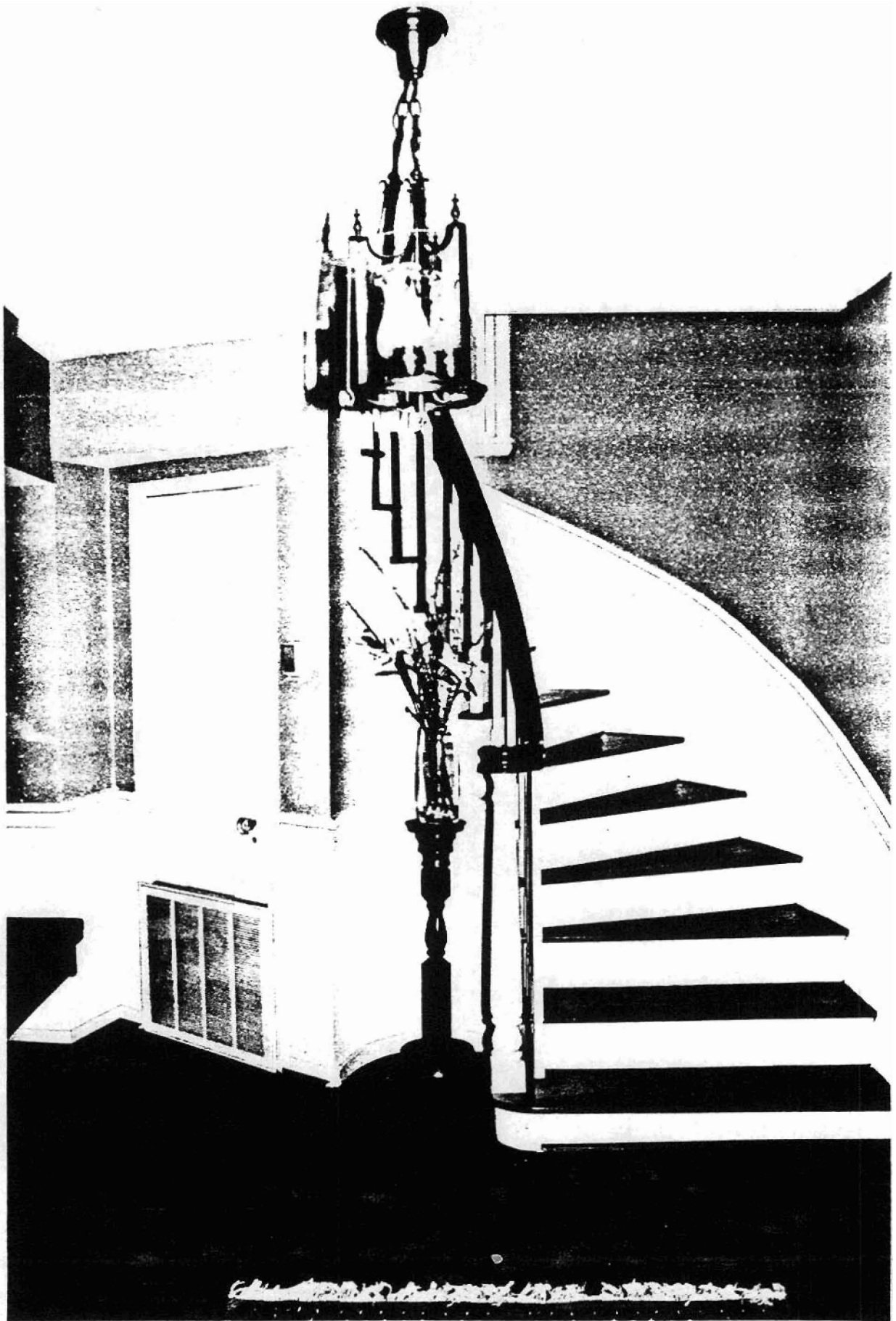

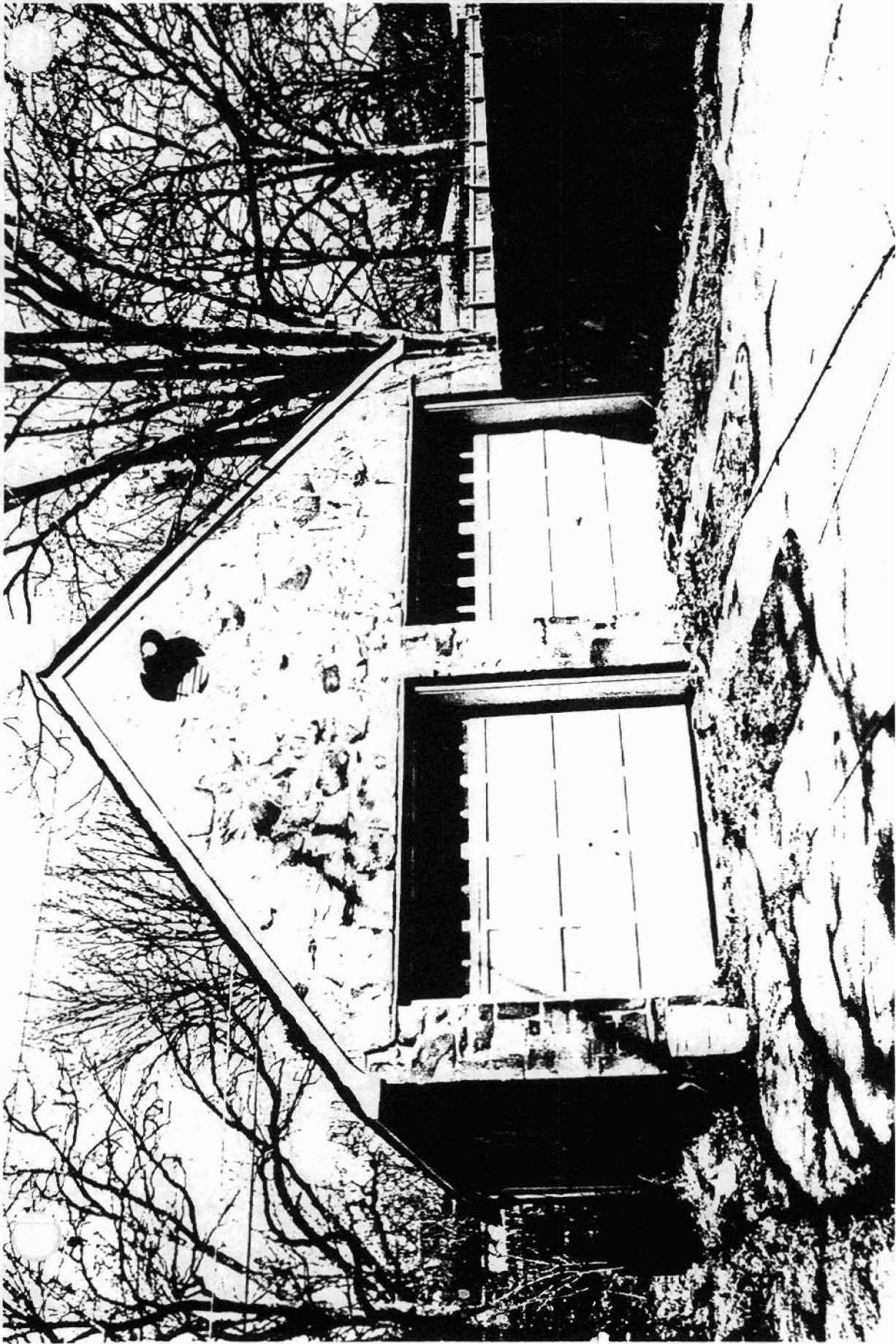
