7. Description

Describe present and historic physical appearance:

Located in East Hardy on U.S. Highway 62/63, the Carrie Tucker House was constructed c. 1928 as a one-story native stone residence in a vernacular interpretation of the Tudor Revival style of architecture. The random-sized, rough-cut, native stones are laid without courses and are pointed with beaded mortar. Like the Graham House next door to the east, the Tucker House is trimmed with maroon-colored brick on all of the corners and around the door and window openings. Whenever possible, a quoin-like treatment is utilized to further enhance the effect. The irregular-plan is covered by a composition shingle, cross-gable roof. There is an exterior stone chimney on the western elevation and interior brick chimney near the rear of the house. There is a small basement under the front part of the house; however, it was never finished and is used only for storage.

The front, or southern, elevation consists of a projecting gable bay to the west, a smaller and stepped-back projecting gable entrance bay in the center, and a pair of three-over-one windows to the east. The western bay has a large three-part, wood-frame, picture window (wide center section, narrow end windows) and a one-over-one wood window facing east. The raised porch and entrance is accessed by concrete steps from the east that are hidden from view from the south by a concrete-capped rock well. The entrance gable has a brick-quoined column and two skillfully executed rock arches. The gable end has an attached wood pendant with an exterior light fixture.

The western elevation contains an identical three-part picture window, the exterior chimney, a pair of three-over-one windows, a pair of small three-pane windows, and a single three-pane window at the northwest corner of the house.

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The rear, or northern elevation consists of a western projecting gable bay with a small three-pane window to the west and a single-leaf entrance flanked with sidelights under a bracketed shed roof. The main gable end bay to the east has a single three-over-one window to the east and a small one-over-one attic window in the gable end which is clad with hexagonal-shaped asphalt shingles.

The eastern elevation is fenestrated by two pairs of three-over-one windows and a small single-pane window in the center of the facade. At the southern end of the elevation is an access door to the basement.

The interior is arranged with the kitchen, dining room, living room, and a sun room on the west side, a center hall, and a bathroom and two bedrooms on the east side. Although wood paneling has been added to some of the rooms, most of the original moldings remain.

Also included in the nomination is a three foot high rock wall across the rear of the property, a stone barbecue pit, a similarly constructed stone and concrete birdbath to the rear, and a loose stacked wall in front and on the east side of the house.

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State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and period of significance noted above:

The Tucker House was constructed by Dolph Hall in the late 1920s for Carrie Tucker. This property is being nominated as an amendment to the "Historic and Architectural Resources of Hardy, Arkansas" multiple property nomination under Criterion C with local significance as a good example in its neighborhood of native stone-constructed house with brick trim that was built in a vernacular interpretation of the Tudor Revival style of architecture. As such it is a significant connection to the building traditions of Hardy where locally available materials were used by local craftsmen to create vernacular renditions of such nationally popular styles as the Tudor Revival.

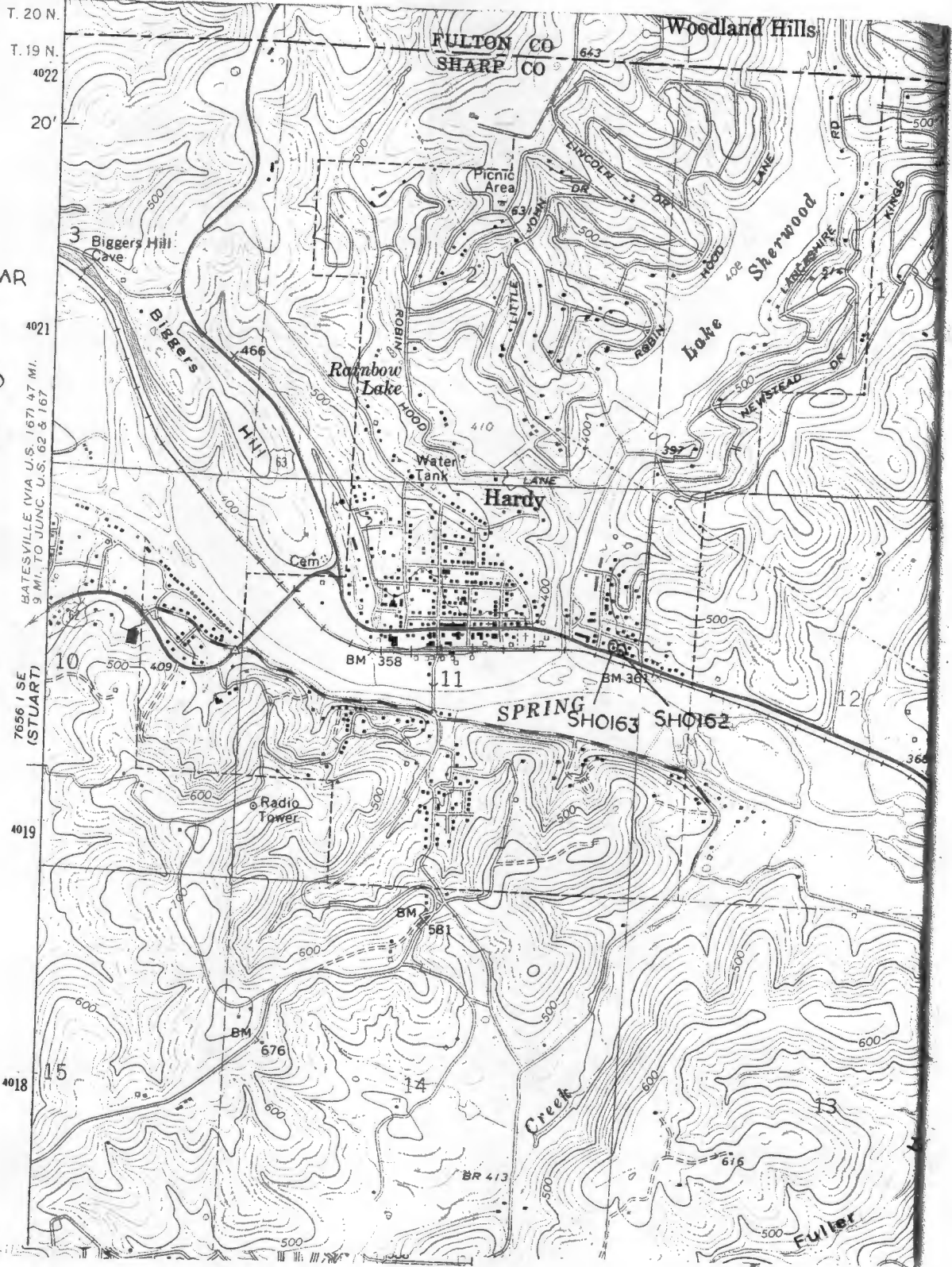
