Summary

The 1929 Floyd Jackson House is a single-story, fieldstone bungalow with beaded mortar. The rectangular-plan residence contains a storage basement and is covered by a composition-shingled side-gable roof and features a large exterior stone chimney on the northern elevation. The rake of the roof extends three feet in the two gable ends, which are ornamented with diamond-shaped asphalt shingles of contrasting colors. Exposed rafter tails are present in the eaves of the side elevations. Another detail of note includes a concrete belt course encircling the structure (also forming the sill for the windows and robust concrete window lintels).

Elaboration

The front, or western, elevation features a half-length, shed-roof porch supported by two roughly fashioned fieldstone columns. The 12' by 30' porch has a solid fieldstone balustrade and a poured concrete floor. A pair of six-over-six wood windows and a central single-leaf entrance are sheltered by the porch, while another pair of six-over-six windows to the south is exposed.

The northern elevation contains the exterior chimney positioned near the western end that is flanked by two narrow one-over-one windows. A six-over-six window is placed near the eastern end.

The rear, or eastern, elevation is composed of a full-facade, shed-roof, frame and screen porch measuring 10' by 40'. There are two six-over-six windows and a single-leaf entrance into the house.

The south elevation is largely obscured by shrubbery. It is fenestrated by

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two pairs of six-over-six windows. The western pair, as well as the western elevation pair of windows around the corner, have horizontal iron bars projecting from below the window sills that were originally used to support flower boxes.

The interior is composed of a living room, dining room, and bedroom on the front, or western, half of the house, while the rear of the house holds a kitchen, bedroom, and a bathroom. Original pine flooring and door, window, and cornice moldings remain.

The house was originally located on a large lot that has since been subdivided and is only about 70' by 80'. The surrounding neighborhood is varied with some historic frame homes, mobile homes, and the large grocery to the south. Originally, it was located near the Hardy school.

The Floyd Jackson House was constructed in 1929 for Floyd and Addie Jackson by local builder, Dolph Hall. It is being nominated within the context "Historic and Architectural Resources of Hardy, Arkansas" under Criterion C with local significance as the best local example of a beaded-mortar,

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fieldstone bungalow with Craftsman-style influences. As such, it reflects the local building traditions that emphasized use of the abundantly available fieldstone.

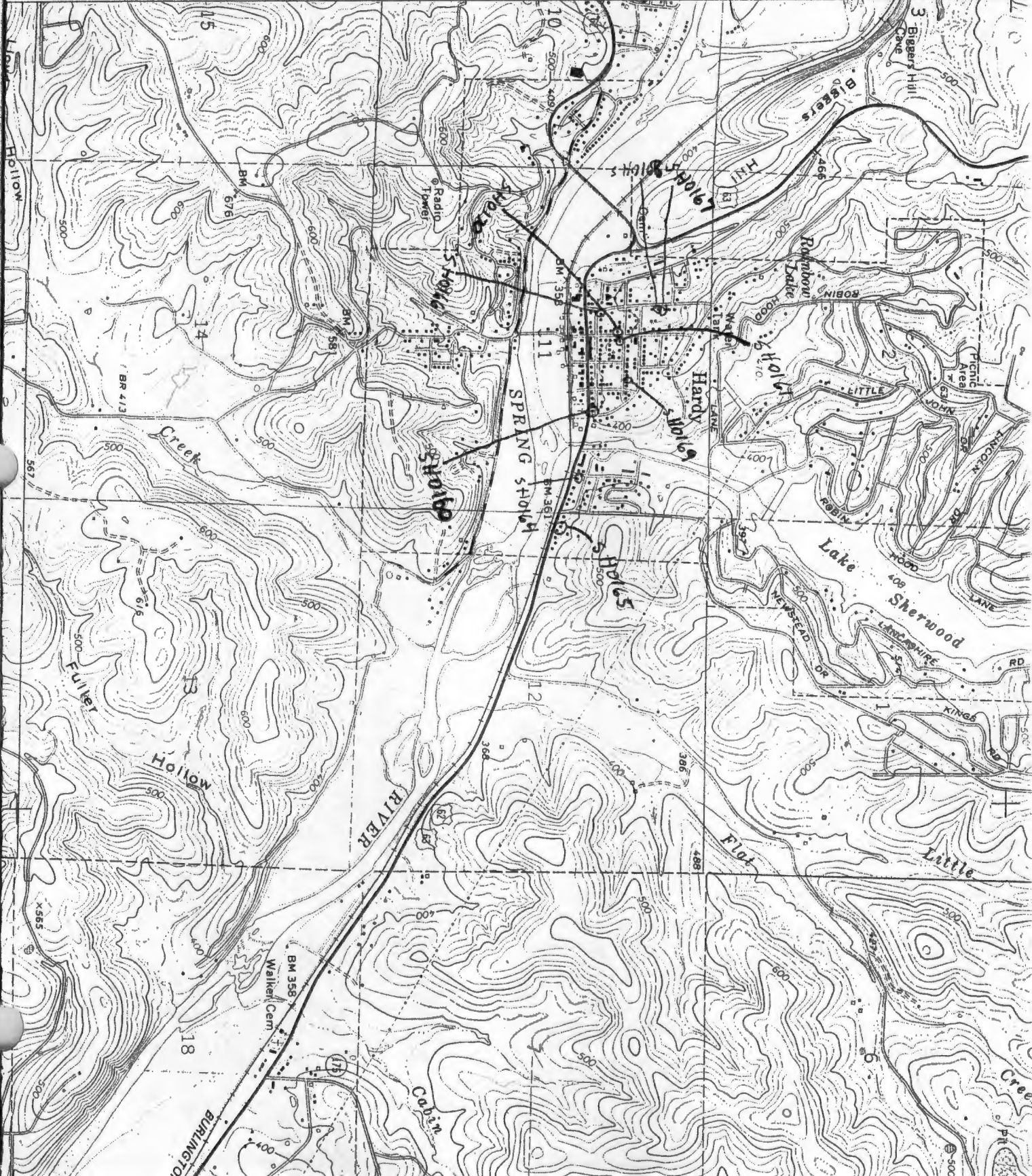
