Summary

Located on Third Street in the original town of Hardy plat, the Daugherty House is sited on a steep hillside, and the front, or southern, elevation presents a two-and-one-half story appearance by virtue of an exposed, full-height basement with fenestration. The rear of the house, however, is barely one-and-a-half stories in height. Constructed in 1932, the rectangular-plan, fieldstone-constructed residence is covered by a clipped-gable roof with a large, clipped-gable dormer on each side elevation and two interior brick chimneys. All of the eaves have exposed rafter tails. It best reflects the Craftsman style of architecture.

Elaboration

The front, or southern, elevation features a full-facade, inset porch (40' X 12') that is accessed by an imposing central staircase with eighteen concrete steps flanked by rock sidewalls. Four square rock columns with segmental arches support the inset porch. A simple wood balustrade connects the columns. Two single-leaf doors are positioned in the center of the main wall with a group of three windows -- a three-over-one wood window flanked by narrower two-over-one windows -- on either side. Identical window groups are utilized on the basement level (one per side) and in the center of the upper level.

The eastern elevation contains a single-leaf entrance into the basement level, two of the standard window groups on the main level, another window group in the dormer, a wide but short four-over-one window, a single-leaf entrance near the rear, and a long three-over-one window.

The rear, or northern, elevation is fenestrated by a small three-over-one window flanked by two window groups and a single-leaf door to the west on the main level and another group of windows in the gable end.

The western elevation is similar to the eastern elevation. It consists of a pair of two-over-one windows near the northern end and three window groups on the main level with another group utilized for the dormer.

The interior contains a living room, dining room, and kitchen on the west side of the central hall and two bedrooms, a storage room, a utility room, and a bathroom on the east side. A straight staircase of fourteen wood steps leads to the upstairs where there are bedrooms on each end of the hall, a bathroom on the west side of the hall, and a bedroom on the east side of the hall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Constructed by local builder J. W. Boak, the Daugherty House was built in 1932 for Hardy business owner Ernest Daugherty and his wife, Maude. Their house is being nominated as an amendment to the "Historic and Architectural Resources of Hardy" multiple property nomination under **Criterion C with local significance** as an excellent and relatively unaltered example of a one-and-a-half-story fieldstone residence designed in the Craftsman style with an unusual exposed basement on the front elevation. As such, it remains a significant link to the building traditions of Hardy, which emphasized the use of such locally available materials as fieldstone in its residential construction.

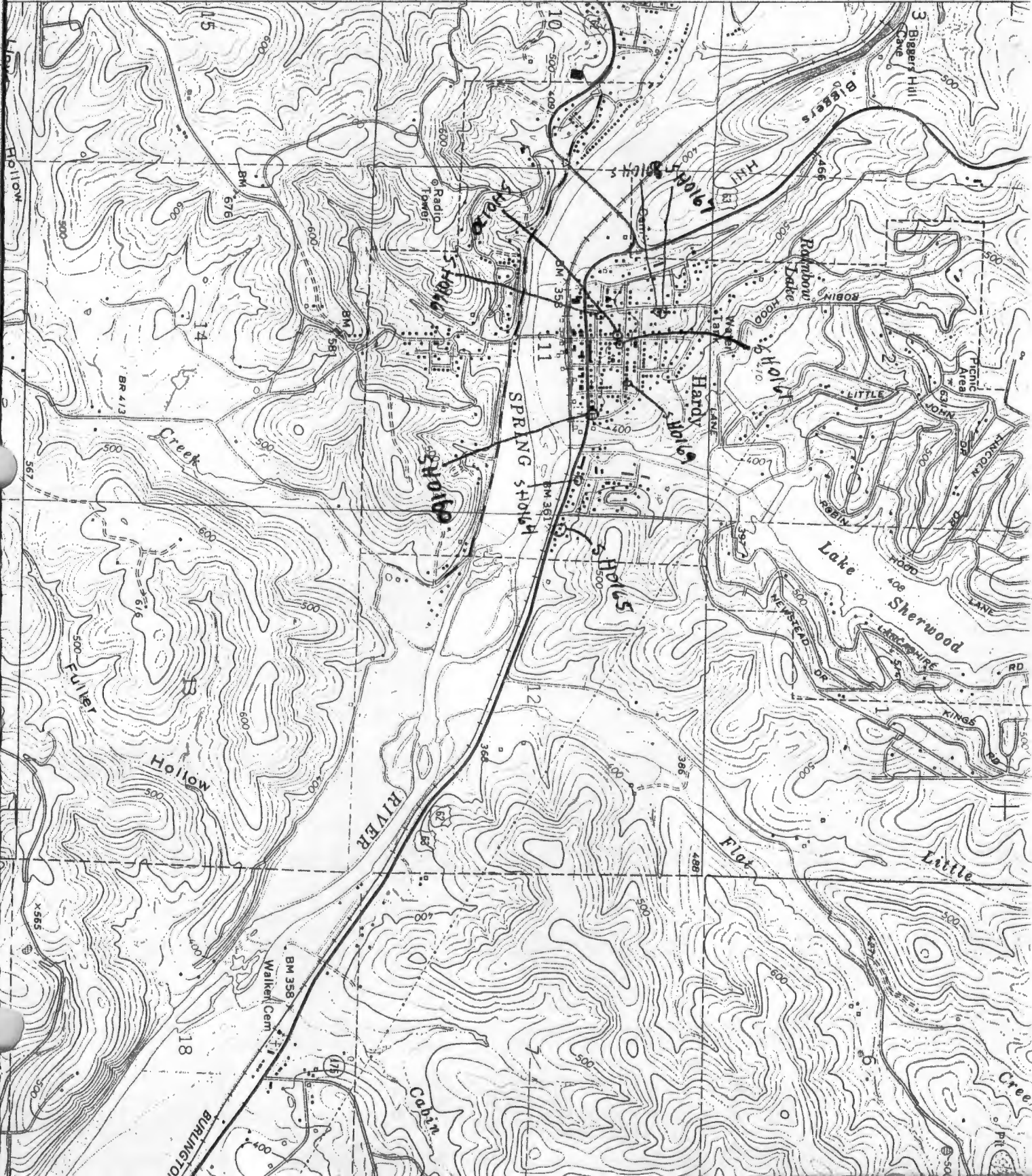
