During the Boom and Bust Era (1914-1939) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The McAdams House is a good example of a one-story, rectangular structure with two projecting bays. The building is of frame construction and clad with novelty siding. The bellcast roof is covered with composition shingles and the entire structure rests on stone piers.

This building is located on the southern edge of Pangburn on the eastern corner of Maple and South Streets. The McAdams House was constructed c. 1915 and is in good condition. Its main, or north elevation is dominated by a projecting bay. This three-sided bay is fenestrated with a single eight-over-one double-hung wood sash window that is flanked by single six-over-one double-hung wood sash windows. Similar six-over-one windows are found on the rest of the original house. Recessed corner porches flank the three-sided bay on the north elevation of the structure. Single asymmetrically placed doors access the porches as does a single centrally placed door on the east side of the bay. The porch roof of the easternmost of the two front porches is supported by a simple wooden box column that rests on a brick pier. The roof of the western porch is also supported by a simple wooden box column but this one rests on a solid wooden balustrade. Other decorative features found on the original building include a wood paneled frieze and exposed jig-sawn rafters on the roof eaves. A brick chimney rises from the southern slope of the bellcast roof. Stretching the full-length of the south elevation is a shed roof addition that envelopes the projecting bay on this side. Small, centrally placed, three-over-one double-hung wood sash windows are found on both the east and west elevations of the rear addition. A similar window is located west of the asymmetrically placed door on the south elevation of the addition. Screened ribbon windows and paired sliding windows are located east of the door.

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Significance

When this building was constructed, c. 1915, it was one of numerous rectangular-shaped buildings built during the Boom and Bust Era (1914-1939). Although there are 138 of these structures extant in the county, few exhibit the amount of integrity found in this house. Therefore, the McAdams House is significant for its contribution to the study of vernacular architecture and is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.
