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Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The Austin Pangburn House is a good example of a one-story, frame, irregularly shaped building. The hip roof slopes downward and terminates with gable wings; the entire roof is covered with composition shingles. The walls are still clad with novelty siding and the entire structure rests on stone piers.

Located on the northwest corner of Main and Austin Streets, this building was constructed within the Pangburn city limits. It was constructed c. 1908, and is still in good condition. The upper portions of the gable ends facing the streets are relieved with a single-pane fixed frame window that is surrounded with diamond shaped wooden shingles. The most heavily decorated gable end faces Main Street and is located on the south elevation of the structure. It has chamfered corners and the roof extends over these chamfers. The two chamfered corners are fenestrated with single one-over-one double-hung sash windows while the central bay of this portion of the building plays host to a single large one-over-one single-hung sash window. Its upper sash consists of multiple-pane leaded glass. The building's original fenestration consisted of symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash windows that were placed either singly or in pairs.

A shed roof wrap-around porch extends from the south elevation of the building over to the east elevation. Doric columns support the roof. Another wrap-around porch originally extended from the west elevation of the structure to the north elevation. Most of this has since been enclosed except for a single bay at the porch's terminus on the north elevation and two bay's at the southern end. This porch has columns similar to ones found on the other porch. A single interior brick chimney rises from the eastern slope of the hip roof.

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Significance

When this house was constructed, c. 1908, it was one of numerous irregularly-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Even though there are sixty-six of this type of building still left in the county very few exhibit the amount of integrity found in the Austin Pangburn House. For this reason it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.
