Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The Dr. McAdams House is a good example of a one and one-half story, frame, primarily square with a projecting gable bay building. The hip roof slopes downward and terminates with gables; the entire roof is covered with composition shingles. The walls are still clad with novelty siding and the entire structure rests on stone piers.

Located on the northwest corner of Main and Searcy Streets this building was constructed within the Pangburn city limits. It was constructed c. 1910, and is still in good condition. The main, or east elevation of the structure is dominated by a one-story porch that extends the full length of the facade. Its shed roof is supported by wooden posts. Openings to the porch consist of single doors and paired one-over-one double-hung sash windows. The upper portion of the projecting gable end is adorned with wood fish scale shingles and gable returns. A gable dormer protrudes from the eastern slope of the hip roof; a small brick chimney is located just south of the dormer. Asymmetrically placed windows are located on the north elevation of the structure. They consist of either single or paired one-over-one double-hung sash windows.

A recessed porch was originally located on the northwest half of the building but it has since been enclosed and screened in. This section of the house is entered by a single door that is housed under a gable roof porch. This porch is supported log posts. Fenestration on this elevation consists of a single one-over-one double-hung sash window. The south elevation of the building features symmetrically placed windows; they are either single or paired. In both instances they are one-over-one double-hung sash windows. The westernmost window was originally a single one but has been replaced by a paired window. A gable roof dormer projects from the southern slope of the hip roof on this elevation. It houses a paired one-over-one double-hung sash window.

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Significance

When this house was constructed, c. 1910, it was one of numerous irregularly-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Even though there are sixty-six of these buildings still left in the county very few exhibit the amount of integrity found in the Dr. McAdams House. For this reason it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.

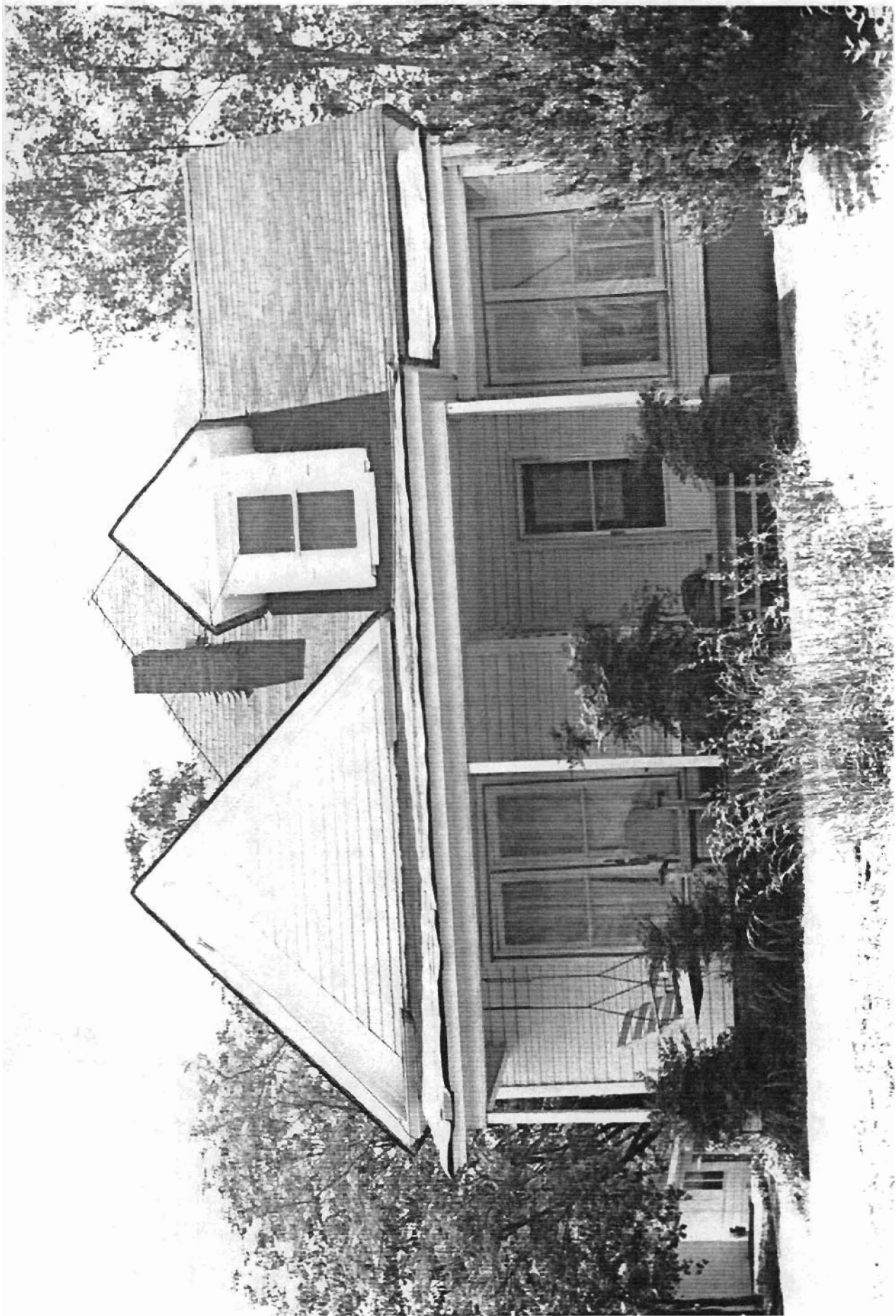

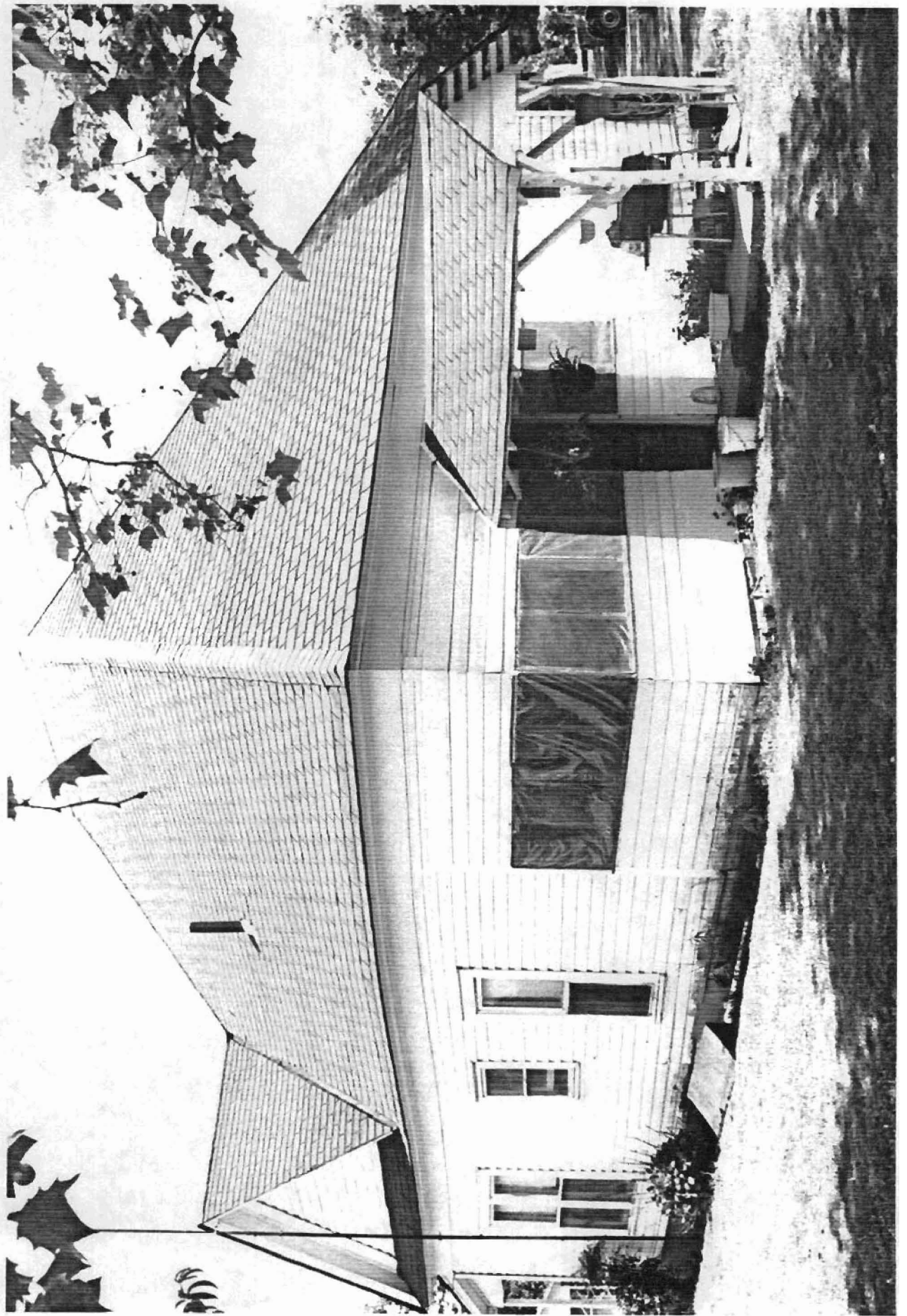

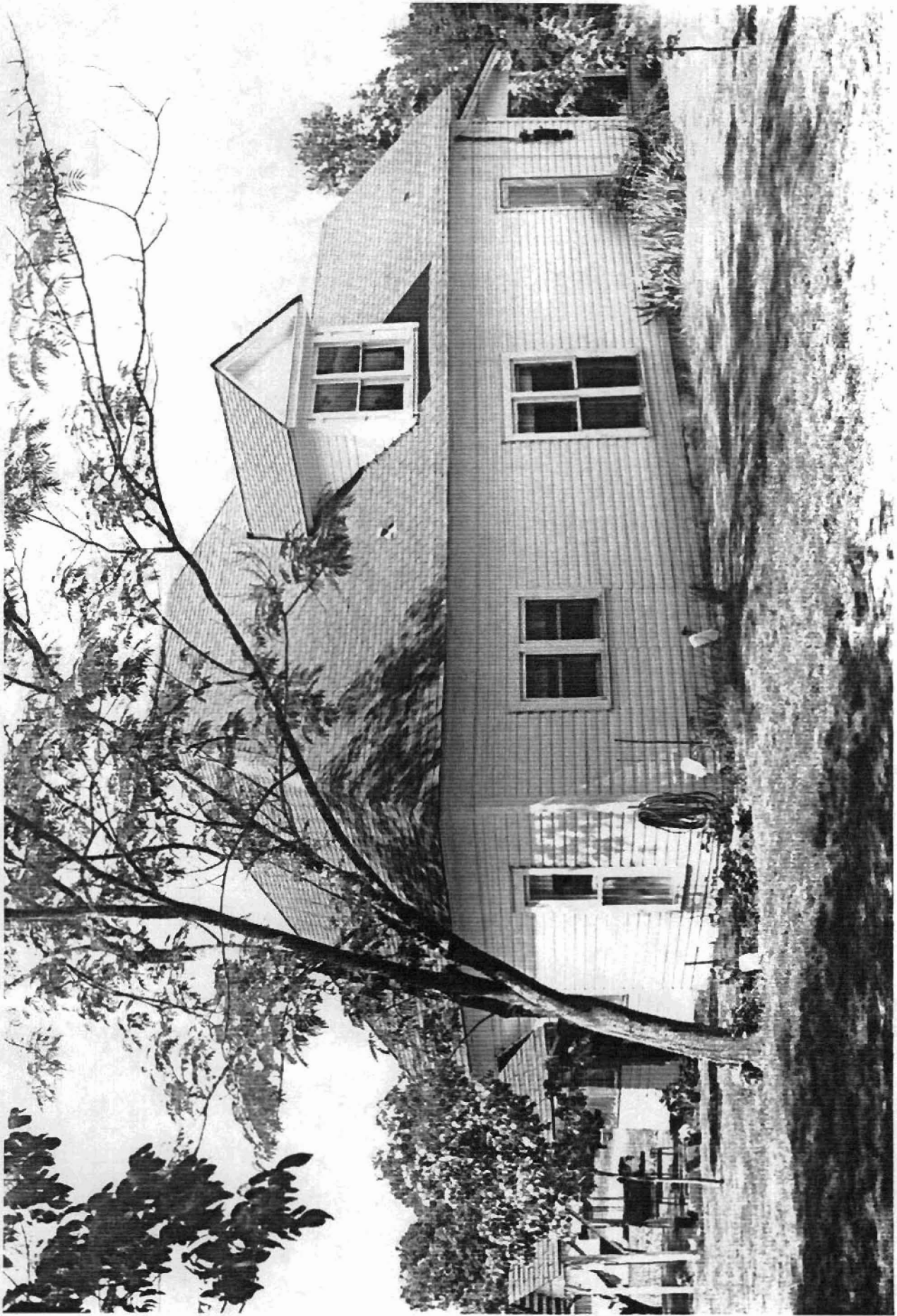
