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Description

The Ward-Stout House is a one-and-one-half story, wood frame Craftsman residence. A gable roof with perpendicular dormers shelters the side gable plan. A single, square brick chimney rises through the roofline between the eastern dormer and the ridge. The roof is covered with composition shingles, the walls are clad in stucco, and the continuous foundation is formed from cast concrete.

The eastern or front elevation features a full-length shed roof porch on the front of the side gable wall of the main house. The wood porch roof projects just below the large, doghouse dormer. The porch is supported by four square stuccoed piers which are connected by a solid balustrade to either side of the entrance stair. The wall beneath the porch is symmetrically organized with four threeover-one wood sash windows flanking the central entrance. The northern and southern gable end elevations are virtually identical and contain the same type of wood sash windows. The western elevation is covered with a rear shed into which a central rear door opens. Another dormer identical to that on the front of the house is placed in the western roof slope also. Exposed rafters decorate the cornices throughout.

The Ward-Stout House is virtually unaltered; it is in good condition.

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Significance Criterion C, local significance

The Ward-Stout House (Part E, Historic Context #4) is the best example in Bradford of a oneand-one-half story, wood frame, side gable plan, Craftsman style residence. Constructed in 1932 and designed by a Mr. Burley Ward, this house is typical of the third period in the evolution of Craftsman style designs in White County. Its floor plan has become very regular and symmetrical and features only the vestiges of the irregularity of plan and elevation which was one of the hallmark features of this building style.
